- I. Call to Order: Phil called the meeting to order at 7:05pm
- II. Adoption of the January 2014 Meeting Minutes- Lisa noted that she is missing from the January attendance. Diane moved to accept the minutes with Lisa's addition and Sue seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- III. Discussion Topics for Future Board Meetings:
  - a. Brainstorming: What type of topics, guests and general edification would the board like?
    - i. Luther introduced Roger Brooks library as a possible option for future Board Meeting topics. It is decided that we would like to make these available to the general public (merchants, township members) and not just the board.
    - ii. Phil opened the floor to other ideas to bring our board members to the table. People had both topics they would like discussed and ideas for hosts. The ideas/topics that were put forward included the following:
      - 1. Sue would like Janice Talley as a speaker.
      - 2. Robert would like to have a board meeting to discuss liquor licenses. Would we support more liquor licenses?
      - 3. Jerry suggested we spend a meeting discussing visual improvements (signs, planters, awnings) to make the downtown look more attractive, as well as cleaner.
      - 4. Jerry also suggested we should discuss how we can help create affinity groups to create more events.
      - 5. Jerry would like a meeting on vacancies and how to address them.
      - 6. Lisa noted that having the mayor attend would be beneficial. Rich and Sean note that they would approach the town. However, Sean noted that Janice would be a great speaker from the town.
      - 7. Sharda asked if we could have someone from the New Jersey Main Street come to speak.

8. Luther suggested the topic of parking. This topic could cover parking duration and parking technology. The parking suggestion spurred a general parking discussion. Luther stated that we have gone from a parking perception problem. Rich and

Nearly, 6,000 people came out for the Norwegian candles, bouncy house, Montclair Center Stage, magician, Madden Game Truck, ice sculptor and other activities. This was a great opportunity to connect with the community and work with entertainment vendors we had not used in the past.

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**Ladies' Night Out** will take place on **Friday, March 14<sup>th</sup> from 6-9pm**. This event is **experience**, not sales, driven. Each participating merchant will offer a tutorial, makeover or activity to engage potential new customers. Merchants are partnering at most locations to create stronger mini-events around the district. We hope that this model will strengthen and inspire merchant partnerships.

The **PeepShow Window Display Contest** will kick off in early April and is an effort to encourage merchants to focus on attractive and interesting window displays and engage the community. All window displays must incorporate the candy Peeps. On **Friday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>** from **3-8pm** participating merchants are encouraged to open their doors to invite the community in to help decorate. On **Saturday April 4<sup>th</sup>** merchants will unveil their window displays and community voting for the best window display will run for two weeks.

**Summer programming** will include (not for publication yet) a **Farmers Market** on **Tuesdays 1-7pm** from **June 3<sup>rd</sup>** through **November 25<sup>th</sup>**.
